

1 WASHROOMS, CHANGE ROOMS AND HOSPITAL ROOMS

The removal of single-sex spaces impacts women's and girls' basic rights to privacy, dignity, and safety. Women are 10x more likely to be sexually assaulted in "gender neutral" than women-only.

2 RAPE AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTERS

Women who've been sexually assaulted deserve places of safety and healing away from males. One of Canada's last remaining women-only rape shelters, Vancouver Rape Relief, was denied public funding for having a single-sex policy.

3 SPORTING COMPETITIONS

Women and girls lose out when males compete with them due to permanent physiological advantages men gain at puberty. Females lose medals, scholarships and the opportunity to compete fairly, and are placed at heightened risk in contact sports like rugby.

4 PROGRAMS, RESOURCES AND AWARDS

Females have been consistently disadvantaged in areas such as the workplace and higher education. Now males who identify as women are taking resources earmarked specifically for females to help close this historical gap.

5 PRISONS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT

Incarcerated women deserve to be housed in single-sex spaces away from men. Now male prisoners, including pedophiles and violent sex offenders, are self-identifying as women and being placed in women's prisons, putting these vulnerable women at risk for further physical and emotional trauma.

6 CRIME STATISTICS

Official crime data is being recorded by gender instead of sex, undermining the reliability of statistics. This leads to an increase in "female" violent offenders because male crimes are being recorded incorrectly as female.

7 SAME-SEX ATTRACTED WOMEN

The right of women to assert their sexual boundaries is being erased by gender self-identification. Lesbians are being pressured to accept males who identify as women as potential dating partners, and accused of "transphobia" if they object.
